



## “Final user selection” short guidelines

NOTE: The following points have to be put in order according to the contents of the modules.

### **1. Technological background**

For any module some technical abilities will be relevant, at least as a medium level user. Office programs, image treatment, and web edition – web 2.0 will also be really required.

### **2. Experience**

The best selection will be anyone who has already worked in a telecentre, or is a professional or a trainer, and have at least basic knowledge about the module’s content. Context knowledge will make the theory content much more practical, suitable with the reality.

### **3. Interpersonal and communicative competences**

Students are going to be trained as e-facilitators, sometimes they will go to work with youngsters, elderly or “vulnerables”, so interpersonal and communicative competences are important to be considered, together with socio-cultural animation competences.

### **4. Motivation**

A motivated student is a good student. It’s a remarkable point also if the applicant has a specific idea of where or for which project (present or future) is going to apply the training contents.

### **5. Geographic distribution**

It’s important to cover a large geographic area, and to balance small country towns and big cities.
